Commissioner Cummings moved and Commissioner Hillier seconded to authorize the Chair to sign a letter of support for a Safe Exchange and Supervised Visitation Center to be operated by the Exchange Club in Owatonna. Motion carried.

Commissioner Lang moved and Commissioner Cummings seconded to authorize the Chair to sign a letter of support for the Austin Housing and Redevelopment Authority to receive Community Activity Set Aside funds to operate the Home Buyers Club, a program to provide down payment assistance and gap financing to eligible families who are now in subsidized housing or on the waiting list for subsidized housing. Commissioner Cummings on behalf of the Building Committee reviewed the planning process of the proposed criminal justice center including the recommendation of the jail study committee in conjunction of the City of Austin's proposed downtown site.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Ellingson to eliminate the proposed downtown location for the criminal justice center project due to cost and size constraints and to limit the location search to "Greenfield" locations. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Ellingson to instruct the building committee to develop one to three final Greenfield locations for the proposed criminal justice center and to include the City of Austin and Austin Utilities in developing the site options. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Lang to instruct the building committee to begin the process for the relocation of Health & Human Services and to request the City of Austin to use funds it had set aside for a downtown economic impact study for the criminal justice center project for a downtown study on a Health & Human Service facility / County Government Administration. Motion carried.

The Personnel Committee provided a recommendation to the Board regarding the proposed VEBA optional health insurance plan prepared by the Insurance Committee.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Ellingson to replace the HMO optional health insurance plan with a VEBA (Voluntary Employee Beneficiary Association) optional health insurance plan effective January 1, 2006 as proposed by the insurance committee except for a modification to eliminate the suggested cash incentive. Motion carried.

Jim Hurm, on behalf of the Housing and Redevelopment Authority and the Transit Board, at the request of the Finance Committee, provided the County Board with a list of options regarding the proposed transit facility project.

Motion made by Commissioner Lang, seconded by Commissioner Ellingson to reject all bids for the transit facility project and to notify the architect the project will not be re-bid. In addition, to authorize the use of county funds for architect fees and \$75,000 to the HRA for their purchase of the property (USEM's body shop) provided the purchase agreement between Mower County and the HRA of Austin is terminated. Motion carried.

At this time a Public Hearing was held in regard to an amendment to Zoning Ordinance Section 14-13 Zoning Permit and Section 14-51 Conditional Uses.

Daryl Franklin, Environmental Services Director, reviewed the Planning Commission recommendations.

No one spoke for or against amending the sections of the Zoning Ordinance.

WHEREAS, the County Board held a public hearing on said amendment on May 24, 2005.

BE IT ORDAINED that the following sections of Section 14-13 and 14-51 of the Mower County Code are amended as follows:

Section 14-13 ZONING PERMIT

Change (c) to (d) and add:

- “c) Rural and Agricultural Home Owners Assumption of Risk Assessment Form. All persons constructing a new home or replacing an existing home in Mower County will be required to sign and have recorded the above mentioned “risk assessment form”. This must be on file with the Mower County Environmental Services Office.

The Rural and Agricultural Home Owners Assumption of Risk Assessment is attached.”

and Add:

“(e) The subdivider or property owner is responsible for all costs associated with “911” signage for addressing and street signs.”

Section 14-51 CONDITIONAL USES

Add:

“Section 14-51.5 PROHIBITED USES

(1) Planned Unit Development”

Sheriff Amazi requested a moratorium on permits for wild animals and requested that the County Board develop and adopt an interim ordinance for the possession of wild animals similar to the interim ordinance adopted by Goodhue County.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Ellingson to issue a one-year moratorium to prohibit any persons from buying, selling, trading, auctioning, leasing, loaning, breeding, possession, owning, caring for, having custody, or control of any wild animal effective immediately and instruct the planning commission to develop an ordinance in regard to the same. Wild animals are defined as follows:

1. All members of the Felidae family including, but not limited to, lions, tigers, cougars, leopards, cheetahs, ocelots, and servals, but not including domestic cats or cats recognized as a domestic breed, registered as a domestic breed, and shown as a domestic breed by a national or international multibreed cat registry association;
2. Bears;
3. All nonhuman primates, including, but not limited to, lemurs, monkeys, chimpanzees, gorillas, orangutans, marmosets, lorises, and tamarins;

A Wild Animal includes any hybrid or cross between an animal listed in 1, 2 or 3 above and a domestic animal and offspring from all subsequent generations of those crosses or hybrids.

The Commissioners voted as follows: Garry Ellingson aye, David Hillier aye, Ray Tucker aye, Richard P. Cummings aye, and Richard Lang nay. Motion carried 4-1.

Motion made by Commissioner Lang, seconded by Commissioner Hillier authorizing the chair to send a letter to the USDA Farm Service Agency indicating that Craig Oscarson or Daryl Franklin are authorized to sign all required USDA forms for the Farm Service Agency Programs. Motion carried.

The Finance Committee made a recommendation on changes to the ISTS loan program. Daryl Franklin, Environmental Services reviewed the program and the recommendation.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Lang to increase the loan period for the Mower County ISTS Loan program from five (5) to ten (10) years subject to approval in this legislative session to authorize state ISTS loan funds for a 10 year loan period. The effective date shall be the effective date of the legislation. In addition, the loan limits shall be increased from \$8,000 to \$10,500 for mound systems and from \$6,500 to \$7,500 for in ground systems. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Cummings to set a public hearing for rezoning of properties in Frankford Township from Rural Management to Agricultural on June 14, 2005 at 10:30 a.m. at the County Board of Commissioner's regular meeting at 201 1st Street NE, Austin, MN. Motion carried.

Resolution

Designating the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the Basis for all Incident Management in Mower County, MN

On motion of Commissioner Ellingson, seconded by Commissioner Cummings, the following Resolution was passed and adopted by the Mower County Board of Commissioners at a meeting held May 24, 2005 at the Courthouse, Austin, Minnesota.

WHEREAS the President of the United States, in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for federal, state, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS the collective input and guidance from all federal, state, local, and tribal security partners has been, and will continue to be vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS it is necessary and desirable that all federal, state, local and tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management, it is critical that federal, state, local, and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform planning, training, and exercising standards, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities, and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal and state funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes;

WHEREAS the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the State and Mower County, including current emergency management training programs;

WHEREAS the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System;

WHEREAS the Governor of the State of Minnesota by Executive Order 05-02, February 9, 2005, has designated the NIMS as the basis for all incident management in the State of Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Mower County Board of Commissioners do hereby establish the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the standard for incident management in Mower County.

The part-time employee will be eligible for benefits prorated for the 18 hour per week position. Motion carried.

The Personnel Committee reported and did not recommend participation in an employee loan program offered through Nationwide Deferred Compensation.

Motion made by Commissioner Ellingson, seconded by Commissioner Hillier to deny participation on the Nationwide Deferred Compensation loan program. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Lang, seconded by Commissioner Cummings, to increase the Solid Waste License Fee from \$25.00 per year to \$100.00 per year effective July 1, 2005. Motion carried. Commissioner Hillier abstained.

The Finance Committee had received and reviewed a request from Community Technologies & Services for funds to support unfounded Charity Work.

Motion made by Commissioner Lang, seconded by Commissioner Cummings to deny the request for funds from Community Technologies & Services for unfounded charity work. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Lang to approve the minutes of May 10, 2005. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Ellingson, seconded by Commissioner Cummings to approve the bi-monthly bills for immediate payment.
