# SPECIAL SESSION OF THE MOWER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

October 25, 2005

The Mower County Board of Commissioners in and for the County of Mower, Minnesota, met in Special Session October 25, 2005 at 8:30 a.m. at the Courthouse in Austin, Minnesota.

#### **GENERAL:**

Commissioner Lang moved and Commissioner Ellingson seconded to authorize application to the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Office of Justice Programs for Methamphetamine Treatment funds for Calendar year 2006 and 2007 in the amount of \$50,000 per year. Funds awarded will be used to purchase treatment services for high risk individuals from Austin Medical Center. Motion carried.

Commissioner Ellingson moved and Commissioner Hillier seconded to utilize CREST funds to pay the costs of prescription co-pays for Mower County clients placed in Intensive Residential Treatment in order to facilitate the proper administration of medications and reduce administrative time and expense expended in collecting small sums. (\$3 to \$18 person) Motion carried.

Commissioner Cummings moved and Commissioner Lang seconded to authorize the Chair to sign letters to Senators Coleman and Dayton and Representative Gutknecht in opposition to proposed cuts in Medicaid funding for case management of persons with mental illness. Motion carried.

Commissioner Lang moved and Commissioner Hillier seconded to reject a request from Sheriffs Youth Programs of Minnesota for a 4% rate increase for calendar year 2006 for juveniles placed in the Halstenson Program. Motion carried.

Commissioner Hillier moved and Commissioner Cummings seconded to approve the destruction of designated Agency files in accordance with DHS Rules and Regulations. All previously approved files have been destroyed. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Cummings to adjourn the meeting 10:09 a.m. to the County Ditch Board. Motion carried.

The special session of the Mower County Board of Commissioners reconvened at 10:37 a.m. following the conclusion of the County Ditch Board meeting.

Mike Hanson, County Engineer, presented professional service proposals for aerial photography of the county a vital part of the GIS project.

Motion made by Commissioner Ellingson, seconded by Commissioner Lang to award the aerial photography project to Mark Hurd of Maple Grove, Minnesota with a low bid of \$68,000 and have the project commence. Motion carried. Full bid abstract on file in the office of the County Auditor and County Engineer.

Mike Hanson updated the Board concerning the Dexter and CSAH 2 construction projects.

A road trip to view the 2005 highway projects was set for Monday, November 7, 2005 leaving from the highway department at 8:30 a.m.

Mike Hanson provided an update on the radio tower project indicating that the site was ready for the tower to be constructed.

Donna Welsh, Finance Director, briefly summarized the monthly investment report for the Commissioners indicating that there are some projects coming due in which there is a need to establish available cash for the projects without a need to sell anything additional and that the county is meeting its budget goals.

Craig Oscarson, County Coordinator, reviewed a proposed credit card policy drafted by the Finance Director. The State Auditor's allows the use of credit cards with an established policy.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Lang to adopt the Mower County Credit Card Policy effective October 25, 2005. A copy of the policy is on file in the office of the County Coordinator. Motion carried.

Meri Jo Lonergan and Normal Nelson, residents of Lyle, made a plea to the Mower County Board of Commissioners that an outside "unbiased" investigator be assigned to investigate their complaints of voter fraud. The residents are aware that the

outcome of the referendum can no longer be overturned. Ms. Lonergan and Ms. Nelson presented to the Board signed petitions for "immediate, expeditious investigation, by an unbiased investigator, of the complaints of irregular balloting of the recent school bond balloting and other irregularities previously reported to the Mower County Attorney and the Mower County Sheriff." It is their desire to see that the alleged voting irregularities be avoided in future referendums and that voter confidence restored. Ms. Lonergan and Ms. Nelson gave some examples of the alleged irregularities in voting during the bond vote.

The County Auditor and County Attorney noted that all previous complaints had been investigated and did not result in any charges. They would investigate any new complaints. The County Attorney further clarified that complaints need detail in terms of names, dates, and further details on the particular event. It was also noted the County Board does not have authority over the Attorney or Auditor on this issue. No action was taken by the Board.

Motion made by Commissioner Cummings, seconded by Commissioner Lang to amend the 2005 Emergency Management Budget for the acceptance of a \$30,000 grant award from the 2005 Homeland Security Grant Program for the purchase of equipment. Motion carried.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Mower County Board of Commissioners requests the State of Minnesota to include \$3.9 million in the bonding bill in order to complete the Shooting Star Trail.
