Dennis Breza, Consumer Survivor Network, met with the Board regarding the Warmline.

Commissioner Tucker moved and Commissioner Lang seconded to notify Cedar House, Inc. of Mower County's intent to cancel its agreement for the purchase of Targeted Case Management services for children, effective March 1, 2008, and seek to negotiate a new agreement at a reduced rate. This action comes as a result of notification by the state that they will discontinue billing the federal government for these services on this date. Motion carried.

Notification regarding Emergency General Assistance fund balance.

Commissioner Hillier moved and Commissioner Lang seconded to authorize the Chair and the Director to sign the following Purchase of Service Agreements:

Len Koehnen, Radio Project Consultant, updated the Board on the project and an issue with interference in the LEC basement. The interference was likely caused by electronic equipment that has been removed. The consensus of the Board to do nothing with the interference problem at this time as it appears to be resolved at this time. Lee Smith, Whitewater Wireless, updated the Board on the Mobile Computer System installation in the squad cars.

At this time a Public Hearing was held in regard to the Environmental Assessment for EnXco (Grand Meadow Wind Farm) to construct a 161kV substation in the NW 1/4 of Section 8, Grand Meadow Township and a new 161 kV high voltage transmission line starting in Section 19 of Pleasant Valley Township and running approximately 6 miles to section 8 of Grand Meadow Township.

Daryl Franklin, Environmental Services Director, reviewed the request and Planning Commission recommendations. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the Environmental Assessment, but also recommended continuing the hearing to February 12, 2008 to address neighboring property owners concerns. Ian Krygowski of EnXco updated the Board on meetings with landowners to resolve concerns. The Board reviewed the site survey.

Motion by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Tollefson to table the public hearings on the Environmental Assessment, CUP #734 and CUP #735 of EnXco to February 12, 2008 at 11:30 a.m. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Tucker to set the letting date of March 3, 2008 at 1:00 p.m. for the following seasonal bids: CP 50-08-05-Weed Spraying, CP 50-08-01, CP 50-08-02, CP 50-08-03, CP 50-08-04, and CP 50-08-07 – Crushed Rock and Seal Coat Aggregate, Salvaged Crushed Concrete Aggregate and Bituminous Mixture, CP 50-08-06 – Striping, Bituminous Materials, and Gasoline Diesel Fuel. 2. Comply with Article IV Excavation of Earth Products of the Mower County Code.
3. Extraction of gravel shall be limited to area shown on Map B.
4. Stock piling of aggregate material shall be at least 40 feet from residential property lines.
5. The gravel pit sides when completed will have a slope no greater than 3:1 horizontal to vertical.
6. Hours of operation shall be 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
7. Comply with the Wetland Conservation Act.
8. Petitioner will provide calcium chloride in front of farms on the haul route up to paved road.

To operate a gravel pit, the crushing of aggregate material and the washing of sand and gravel materials on approximately 23 acres of the site.

Notice having been duly given and a hearing held January 29, 2008, on said petition.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mower County Board accepts and adopts the findings of fact of the Mower County Planning Commission in the five required areas; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that said petition is hereby approved, as recommended by the Mower County Planning Commission with conditions as follows:

1. An \$18,500.00 Restoration Bond (\$2,000 for the first acre and \$750 for each additional acre based on a 23 acre parcel) shall be posted with the Mower County Auditor while the pit is in operation.
2. Stock piling of aggregate material shall be at least 40 feet from residential property lines.
3. Owner must contact the Mower County SWCD regarding the Wetland Conservation Act and provide the County a copy of one of the following:



- a. A "No Loss Determination" (no wetlands on site).
- b. A "Wetland Exemption" (the act does not apply).
- c. A "Wetland Replacement Plan" approval.
4. Owner must provide a copy to the County of an Erosion Control Plan for the site by working with the Mower County SWCD or by hiring a private contractor.
5. Ulland Brothers must maintain a low water mist during crushing operation.
6. Any runoff that would be present from this low water mist during the crushing operation must be contained and disposed by Ulland's.
7. Hours of operation would be 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The petitioner may be allowed up to 30 working days per year of extended operating hours pursuant to 72 hours written notice to Mower County Environmental Services. Extended hours of operation are only to be authorized Monday through Friday.
8. This permit is based upon representation given by the applicant during the hearing process and any misrepresentation presented in this process may be grounds for revoking the permit.
9. If any damage beyond normal usage results in damaging the County road, petitioner/owner will be responsible for this damage.
10. No storage of fuel or equipment is allowed in the pit.
11. The placement of a berm along the County road is subject to approval by the County Engineer.
12. The petitioner must comply with Minnesota Department of Natural Resources regulations.

This permit is in accordance with Section 14-51(i) of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance.
