SPECIAL SESSION OF THE MOWER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

September 8, 2009

The Mower County Board of Commissioners in and for the County of Mower, Minnesota, met in Special Session September 8, 2009 at 8:30 a.m. at the Courthouse in Austin, Minnesota.

GENERAL:

Overview of director's report.

Presentation on fraud investigation with Ruth Schmidt.

Commissioner Tucker moved and Commissioner Lang seconded to approve the revised Employee Safety Policy. Motion carried.

Review of the Deloitte's study on the Minnesota Department of Human Services Child Support Enforcement Division.

Commissioner Hillier moved and Commissioner Gabrielson seconded to authorize the Chair and the Director to sign the following Purchase of Service Agreements:

- a. Good Samaritan Society Home Care renew contract for Home & Community Based Waiver Services, effective July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.
- b. Independent Mgmt. Services renew contract for Home & Community Based Waiver Services, effective September 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Lang moved and Commissioner Tucker seconded to approve the destruction of designated Agency files in accordance with DHS Rules and Regulations. All previously approved files have been destroyed. Motion carried.

SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIONS:

Commissioner Hillier moved and Commissioner Lang seconded to approve the Social Service Actions. Motion carried.

INCOME MAINTENANCE ACTIONS:

Commissioner Gabrielson moved and Commissioner Tucker seconded to approve the Income Maintenance Actions. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Gabrielson to discontinue the Mower County Water Lab services on or before January 1, 2010 as follows:

- 1. Environmental Services Director to notify all current customers and provide information on other private and public options.
- 2. Relocate all remaining staff to the Recycling Center or alternate options on or before January 1, 2010 and reutilize the current facility to either climate control storage or lease space and to refer this component to the Building Committee for a recommendation.
- 3. Refer potential modifications to the vacant position of Office Support Specialist, Sr. or other positions in order to transfer the non-water lab duties of the lab technician to the appropriate position to the Personnel Committee for a recommendation.
- 4. Refer the need to provide temporary clerical assistance during the transition to the Personnel Committee for a recommendation.
- 5. Refer the component of converting the zoning department files to an electronic format to staff for a recommendation to the appropriate Board Committee.

Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Hillier, seconded by Commissioner Gabrielson to amend Personnel Policy B220 Employee Recognition Policy by amending the language in paragraph "Length of Service Recognition" as follows:

Length of Service Recognition

The Human Resource Department shall ensure that an annual Employee Recognition event takes place. They will obtain calculate monetary gifts, send invitations, order refreshments, create certificates, and budget the necessary funds. Awards will be presented by the Board of Commissioners for Employee Recognition in September. The following anniversaries shall be observed with a monetary gift:

The monetary gift will be paid out on the employee's next regular payroll check following the Employee Recognition. The amount will be a supplemental wage indicated with a separate line item as "recognition" and the gift is subject to payroll taxes.

Commissioner Tucker, Finance Committee, reviewed the committee's recommendation for the 2009 proposed tax levy.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Hillier to set the proposed 2010 tax levy at a 1.5% increase for a total proposed levy of \$15,100,659 incorporating the proposed cuts as outlined in the proposed budget and levy memo to the board dated September 4, 2009 and incorporated herein by reference. The proposed budget is as follows:

Commissioner Hillier indicated that he thought some of the proposed cuts should be reconsidered: hire a new part-time position in the Assessor's office (the request had already been made for 2009 and denied and he feels that this would be a "small" investment for an important need); provide funding (suggested using a portion of the fund balance) for the visitation center (provides a much needed service); and still provide some funding for the Elderly Advisory Board (the advisory board is willing to meet voluntarily but would require some funding for mailings, etc.). Commissioner Hillier understands that the budget and levy task of the Finance Committee is difficult but requests that the Finance Committee reconsider these cuts.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Lang to set the Truth-in-Taxation public hearing for December 1, 2009 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commissioner's Board room. Motion carried.

Mike Hanson, County Engineer, presented bid information received for project SP 88-070-009 for Edgeline rumble strips in Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Mower, Olmsted, Rice, Steele, Wabasha and Winona Counties. Three bids were received.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Hillier to award the bid for SP 88-070-009 to the low bidder AAA Striping Service Co. with a low bid of \$597,455 and have the project commence. Motion carried. Full bid abstract on file in the office of the County Auditor-Treasurer and County Engineer.

Motion made by Commissioner Gabrielson, seconded by Commissioner Hillier to set the project letting date to October 12, 2009 at 1:00 p.m. at the office of the County Highway Department and awarded at the County Board of Commissioner's meeting for County project for partial construction of the Shooting Star Trail between Adams and Rose Creek and authorize the chair and coordinator to sign the agreements with the Department of Natural Resources. The project includes tree removal, culvert removal and replacement, timber bridge railings and grading and aggregate base near the bridges and culvert replacements. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Lang to approve the minutes of September 1, 2009. Motion carried.
