Jeff Spartz, Executive Director of the Association of Minnesota Counties (AMC), provided the Board with an update on the AMC initiatives and "MAGIC."

The Board recessed at 10:07 a.m. and reconvened at 10:24 a.m.

Father Spindler made a request that the County Board assume the care of the Prairie View Cemetery pursuant to Minnesota Statute §306.243. The cemetery is abandoned and he has been taking care of the cemetery with the help of another individual at their own time and expense. Father Spindler feels that he is not capable of caring for the property much longer. A discussion followed his request and the County Attorney will research the matter and the Finance Committee will review the County Attorney's research and report back to the Board.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Ankeny to approve the Family Planning Special Projects grant agreement between the Minnesota Department of Health and Mower County Community Health Services for \$57,793 beginning July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2013. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Bennett, seconded by Commissioner Reinartz to approve the "Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Grant" between the Minnesota Department of Health and Mower County Community Health Services in the amount of \$24,333 beginning August 10, 2011 through December 31, 2012. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Ankeny, seconded by Commissioner Reinartz to approve the "Standards Self-Assessment Project Grant Agreement" between the Minnesota Department of Health and Mower County Community Health Services in the amount of a one-time payment of \$2,500. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Bennett to amend the 2011 Law Enforcement budget for dispatch/deputy mapping updates in the amount of \$7200 from reserve contingency and authorize the appropriate transfer of funds as necessary. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Bennett to authorize Public Works ("Recycling") to cease the recycling of tires at the Mower County

recycling center effective September 1, 2011. (The Recycling Center will still recycle the tires of the Mower County fleet of vehicles and Township vehicles.) Motion carried.

- Public Law 920, as amended

- Public Law 99-499 (SARA Law of 1986)
- Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 12, as amended (Civil Defense Act)
- Minnesota Statutes, Section 299K.01 (Emergency Planning & Community Right to Know Act)
- Minnesota Statutes, Section 299J, as amended (The Minnesota Pipeline Safety Act)
- Minnesota Statutes, Section 103F, Subdivision 3, (Emergency Flood Protection Measures)
- Minnesota Division of Emergency Management (DEM) Directors Handbook
- Common County Emergency Management Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Mower County Sheriff's Department and the Mower County Emergency Management Director have prepared the Mower County Local Emergency Operations Plan to provide direction in cases of any disaster/emergency.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Mower County Board of Commissioners hereby approves the Mower County Local Emergency Operations Plan for 2011.
