### **COUNTY BOARD**

The Special Session of the Board was reconvened at 9:07 a.m. for regular business items.

Motion made by Commissioner Gabrielson, seconded by Commissioner Reinartz to authorize the Board Chairman and Community Health Services Administrator to sign a letter of support for the services provided by the Children's Dental Health Clinic. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Reinartz to approve the updated 2012 sliding fee scale for Child and Teen Checkup screenings performed by Mower County Health Services. Motion carried.

Lisa Kocer, Community Health Services Administrator, provided information reported in the 2011 Infectious Disease Report and provided updates on other community health issues and activities.

The Board recessed at 9:27 a.m. and reconvened at 9:44 a.m.

Commissioner Tucker reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee that there has been a request for a stipend for a Health & Human Services employee performing additional financial functions to assist with the payroll transition and year-end activities. The Health & Human Services Fiscal Supervisor has been training the new Payroll Benefits Coordinator leaving her unable to perform all the duties of her position and Todd Lysne has been assuming some of the additional duties to ensure the financial duties are completed. The staff proposes to offer Todd a stipend of \$250 per pay period beginning October 8, 2012 to complete these additional duties which is estimated at 10-15 hours per week. The money is available in the existing budget.

Motion made by Commissioner Tucker, seconded by Commissioner Gabrielson to approve a \$250 per pay period stipend for Todd Lysne to extend from October 8, 2012 through the week ending February 1, 2013 as long as there is no total budget increase necessary. Motion carried.

Jerry Reinartz reported on behalf of the Building Committee that the committee has been presented with a quote for generator fuel tank removal for LEC and H&HS project. The City of Austin included the removal of the tank as part of an RFP for tank removals. The estimated cost is \$11,686.91 which will be a split with 28% of the cost charged against the LEC budget and 72% against the general fund.

Motion made by Commissioner Reinartz seconded by Commissioner Tucker to approve the quote as part of the City of Austin's Request for Proposal for generator fuel tank removal from the LEC parking lot as part of the LEC and H&HS remodel project in the amount of \$11,686.91 of with 28% of the cost shall be charged against the LEC budget and 72% against the general fund. Mike Hanson, Public Works Director, provided the board with an update on the grandstand at the fairgrounds. A hazmat inspection has been scheduled.

In addition, Mike Hanson provided a preliminary report on the condition status of Mower County roads that are not eligible for CSAH funding. The Board indicated that the department should proceed with design plans for the roads that appear to be in need of upgrades so that they will be "shovel" ready when the Board approves the upgrades to be made.

Motion made by Commissioner Gabrielson, seconded by Commissioner Tucker to approve contract amendment with the Department of Ag BMP for an additional \$34,500 for low interest septic system loans. Motion carried.

At this time the Board continued the Public Hearing for CUP #784 of Leonard Grant for an agricultural-oriented business; specifically a livestock buying station in Section 32, Udolpho Township.

The Chair asked staff if there were additional comments or reports. Angie Knish, Environmental Services, had provided the Board with a report including exhibits. Commissioner Reinartz commented that after reviewing the report that the only significant difference in a feedlot and a buying station was an increase in the volume of traffic on a daily basis for a buying station. There is a MnDOT access driveway permit for commercial use and Mr. Slavin illustrated a proposed traffic flow report on the property. The County Attorney indicated that these issues cannot be taken into account when making a decision on the CUP.

The Chair called for new testimony only from persons in favor of CUP #784. None was received. The Chair then called for new testimony only from persons against CUP #784. Comments were made concerning Udolpho Township's ruling on the CUP however the County Attorney indicated that the action(s) taken by Udolpho Township cannot be considered during the County Board's ruling on CUP #784.

Location: A 5 parcel, located in Section 32, Udolpho Township (T104N-R18W),

and legally described as: The South 435.00 feet of the East 500.00 feet

of the SE1/4 SW1/4 Section 32-T104N-R18W, Mower County,

Minnesota; subject to highway easement on the southside thereof, on a

parcel identified per tax records as 18.032.0035

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on September 25, 2012 before the Mower County Planning Commission at 7:00 p.m. at the Mower County Government Center in the Commissioner's board room, on said petition.

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on October 2 and October 23, 2012 before the Mower County Board of Commissioners, on said petition.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Mower County Board has reviewed, accepts and adopts the findings of fact of the Mower County Planning Commission in the five required areas, which is hereby adopted by reference and kept on file in the office of Environmental Services; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that said petition is hereby approved, as recommended by the Mower County Planning Commission with conditions as follows:

- 1. Applicant shall follow all state, federal and local regulations regarding the proposed use; and
- 2. The Owner/Applicant shall keep the site in a neat, orderly and aesthetically pleasing condition; and
- 3. The Owner/Applicant shall work cooperatively with Mower County to mitigate any issues brought to the attention of the County that are found to be legitimate and valid that may create a nuisance or health threat to adjoining landowners from the proposed use, and
- 4. The Owner/ Applicant shall provide adequate area onsite to park, back, turn-around or etc. so as to not create a nuisance or hazard to the traveling public. The trucks cannot be parked or backed onto the premises from the road or its right-of-way; and

- 5. This Conditional Use Permit shall lapse, and shall be no longer valid upon two-years of non-use; and
- 6. This Conditional Use Permit shall lapse and shall be no longer valid if the proposed use is not established within one year of being granted by the Board of Commissioners, and
- 7. The Owner/Applicant shall abide by all road and bridge weight restrictions or postings that apply to roads used as an ingress/egress to the property; and
- 8. The Owner/Applicant shall be liable for any road damages as a result of this operation as stated under MN Statute 169.88, cited above; and
- 9. Any vermin, flies, or other pests shall be controlled by feasible methods; and
- 10. This permit is based upon representation given by the applicant during the hearing process and any misrepresentation presented in this process may be grounds for revoking the permit.

This permit is in accordance with 14-49 (Agricultural District) and 14-28 (Conditional Use Permits) of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance (effective date 01/01/2003).
