The Mower County Board of Commissioners in and for the County of Mower, Minnesota, met in Special Session May 6, 2014 at 1:00 p.m. at the Government Center in Austin, Minnesota.

Motion made by Commissioner Glynn, seconded by Commissioner Reinartz to approve the agenda with additions as follows: 1) Set prescription co-pay at the jail, 2) Amend the highway 2014 budget for CIP designated projects (2 bridges and County 53); 3) Consideration of letter received from Rinke Noonan for a \$500 contribution toward lobbying against public water legislation and 4) award bid on CP 50-14-02 (County 53 project). Motion carried.

Commissioner Ankeny, on behalf of the Personnel Committee stated that the committee had reviewed a request from the Highway department seeking authorization for hiring summer temporary laborers.

Motion made by Commissioner Ankeny, seconded by Commissioner Glynn to authorize the Human Resources Director to hire temporary, non-benefited summer highway help at a rate of \$10 per hour within 2014 budget parameters. Motion carried.

Commissioner Ankeny further reported that the Human Resources department has received a resignation notice from Karen Freese, Public Health Nurse. Her resignation is to be effective June 3, 2014.

Motion carried.

Craig Oscarson, County Coordinator, informed the Board that a letter has been received from Rinke Noonan due to changes in EPA rules for waters in the US. The changes may add more costs to manage ditches. There is a question concerning the definition of "public water." Rinke Noonan represents numerous ditch authorities and is offering/requesting a \$500.00 contribution from counties to represent them to lobby against the rule changes.

Motion made by Commissioner Reinartz, seconded by Commissioner Ankeny to approve the \$500 investment to Rinke Noonan to represent Mower County on the ditch rules/legislation matter. Motion carried.

It was reported that there may be a question on the proper publication of the public hearing for CUP #802.

Motion made by Commissioner Reinartz, seconded by Commissioner Glynn to table CUP #802 / rezone issue until after it has been republished. Motion carried.

A Public Hearing was held in regard to CUP #803 of Valerie Raverty/Ulland Brothers, Inc. to mine clay borrow located in Section 22, Lansing Township.

Angie Knish, Environmental Services, reviewed the permit and Planning Commission recommendations to approve the request with 21 conditions. The only issued raised during the Planning Commission's meeting was a concern for dust. It was reported that Lansing Township has reviewed and approved a CUP for this matter.

The Petitioner, Valerie Raverty, on behalf of Ulland Brothers, Inc. was present and explained the request in additional detail.

On motion of Commissioner Glynn, seconded by Commissioner Ankeny, the following Resolution was passed and adopted by the Mower County Board of Commissioners at a meeting held May 6, 2014 at the Government Center, Austin, Minnesota.

The Mower County Planning Commission having presented to the Mower County Board of Commissioners, CUP #803 of Valerie Raverty/Ulland Brothers, Inc., Petitioner, (Matt & Angie Taylor, landowners) and to be issued pursuant to the Mower County Zoning Regulations for:

For mining of clay borrow

Location: On a 5 acre portion of 80 acre parcel, located in Section 22, Lansing Township (T103N-R18W), and legally described as: North Half (½) of the Northwest Quarter (NW ¼) Section 22 Township 103N Range 18W, Lansing Township, Mower County, Minnesota, on a parcel identified per tax records as 08.022.0110

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on April 29, 2014 before the Mower County Planning Commission at 7:00 p.m. at the Mower County Government Center in the Commissioner's board room, on said petition.

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on May 6, 2014 before the Mower County Board of Commissioners, on said petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mower County Board has reviewed, accepts and adopts the findings of fact of the Mower County Planning Commission in the five required areas, which is hereby adopted by reference and kept on file in the office of Environmental Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said petition is hereby approved, as recommended by the Mower County Planning Commission with conditions as follows:

1. Applicant shall follow all state and federal regulations regarding the proposed use; and
2. Owner must contact the Mower County SWCD regarding the Wetland Conservation Act and provide the County a copy of one of the following:
 - a. A "No Loss Determination" (no wetlands on site)
 - b. A "Wetland Exemption" (the act does not apply)
 - c. A "Wetland Replacement Plan" approval
3. Secure required MPCA NPDES Permit and provide a copy to Mower County Environmental Services Department; and
4. A \$5,000.00 Restoration Bond (\$2,000 for the first acre, plus \$750 for each additional acre or part of an acre based on a 5 acre parcel) must be posted with the County Auditor valid through the life and operation of the Clay Borrow pit; and

5. Comply with Article IV Excavation of Earth Products of the Mower County Ordinance; and
6. There shall be no blasting allowed as part of this mining operation; and
7. Excavation shall not go into or below the water table; and
8. Extraction of clay shall remain at least thirty (30) feet from all adjoining property lines and thirty (30) feet from any road right-of-way. The 30 foot setback between properties may be decreased when done so in writing and the signed and notarized document is recorded with the Mower County Recorder's Office; and
9. The clay borrow pit operation shall be limited to the plan area as submitted and held on-file; and
10. When project is completed; top soil shall be returned and the site shall be returned to farmable land; and
11. Hours of Operation shall be limited to: Monday – Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Exception shall be made to these time restrictions for emergency purposes. The owner/operator shall be responsible for informing the county of the emergency that precipitates the need outside of normal business hours (e.g. sand needed for flood mitigation). Nothing in this condition prohibits the owner/permittee to set their own business hours within or less than the specified hours listed above, and
12. Access driveway costs are to be bore by the petitioner; and
13. The Owner/Applicant shall abide by all road and bridge weight restrictions or postings that apply to roads used as an ingress/egress to the property; and
14. Owner/Operator/Permittee shall be subject to MN 169.88 regarding any road damages; and
15. Any mud, dirt or debris transported to public roads shall be cleared, scraped or removed immediately so as not create a public health or safety risk to the traveling public; and
16. Owner/Operator/Permittee may be required to provide dust control (not to utilize used oil, as it is an illegal use) during high traffic volumes or upon nuisance levels, and
17. No burying of waste material is allowed within the pit area and to do so would be in violation of MPCA Regulations and Mower County Solid Waste Ordinance; and
18. Petitioner/Owner shall be required to cure any violations under procedures of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance as it exists or may be amended. Mower County shall have all rights to abate any violations by such remedies as may be available to it under any applicable Statutes; and
19. A conditional use permit shall become void two (2) years from the date of approval by the County Board if no construction has begun or the use has not been established. For the purposes of this provision, construction shall include the installation of footings, slab, foundation, posts, walls or other portions of a building. Site preparation, land clearing or the installation of utilities shall not constitute construction. A conditional use permit shall become void if the use is discontinued for a period of one (1) year. (Refer Section 14-36 Discontinuance); and
20. A violation of any condition set forth in a conditional use permit shall be a violation of this Ordinance and shall automatically terminate the permit (refer Section 14-35 Revocation); and

21. This permit is based upon representation given by the applicant during the hearing process and any misrepresentation presented in this process may be grounds for revoking the permit.

This permit is in accordance with 14-49 (Agricultural District) and 14-28 Conditional Use Permits) of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance (effective date 01/01/2003).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said petition is hereby approved, as recommended by the Mower County Planning Commission with conditions as follows:

1. A Zoning Permit and ISTS Permit must be obtained prior to construction of the residence and/or any other structure.
2. An ISTS shall be designed, installed and maintained according to MN Rules 7080 & Mower County's SSTS Ordinance; a secondary site shall be located for future placement and placed on a map and kept on file in the CUP file and homeowner's records. The area should be preserved and protected from compaction and/or construction or other damages. A secondary site shall be found and preserved for both parcels being created.
3. Petitioner must sign a "Rural and Agricultural Home Owners Assumption of Risk Assessment Form" and have it recorded at the Mower County Recorder's Office.
4. 911 addressing is required to be obtained through the Mower County Highway Dept. before construction.
5. The owner shall either combine the subdivided portion of the property with the adjoining land that they own to create a parcel of land greater than or equal to 10 acres in size to avoid subdivision and platting. If the landowner chooses not to combine the land into one parcel that exceeds the subdivision ordinance; the landowner shall comply with the subdivision and platting ordinance prior to permits being issued for construction.
6. A conditional use permit shall become void two (2) years from the date of approval by the County Board if no construction has begun or the use has not been established. For the purposes of this provision, construction shall include the installation of footings, slab, foundation, posts, walls or other portions of a building. Site preparation, land clearing or the installation of utilities shall not constitute construction. A conditional use permit shall become void if the use is discontinued for a period of one (1) year. (Refer Section 14-36 Discontinuance); and
7. A violation of any condition set forth in a conditional use permit shall be a violation of this Ordinance and shall automatically terminate the permit (refer Section 14-35 Revocation); and
8. This permit is based upon representation given by the applicant during the hearing process and any misrepresentation presented in this process may be grounds for revoking the permit.

Location: On a 9.48 parcel, located in Section 7, Dexter Township (T103N-R16W), and legally described as: a 9.48 acre parcel located in the NE1/4, Mower County, Minnesota on a parcel identified per tax records as 05.007.0010

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on April 29, 2014 before the Mower County Planning Commission at 7:00 p.m. at the Mower County Government Center in the Commissioner's board room, on said petition.

Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on May 6, 2014 before the Mower County Board of Commissioners, on said petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mower County Board has reviewed, accepts and adopts the findings of fact of the Mower County Planning Commission in the five required areas, which is hereby adopted by reference and kept on file in the office of Environmental Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said petition is hereby approved, as recommended by the Mower County Planning Commission with conditions as follows:

1. Applicant shall follow all state and federal regulations regarding the proposed use and any bi-products of the proposed use; and
2. MPCA Noise standards shall not be exceeded. If questionable noise levels arise, it shall be the burden of the owner/applicant to show that he/she is within state noise standards; and
3. The C.U.P. is applicable to the parcel currently identified as PIN 05.007.0010; and (briefly) described as a 688ft x 600ft parcel; and
4. The Owner/Applicant shall keep the site in a neat, orderly and aesthetically pleasing condition; and
5. Limit outside storage to no more than 40 pieces of equipment; and
6. Items held for sale will be arranged in an orderly fashion with reasonable efforts made to provide a visually appealing display and a minimizing of visual effects; and
7. Customer density is not expected to exceed 10 vehicles at one time; and
8. The Owner/Applicant shall work cooperatively with Mower County to mitigate any issues brought to the attention of the County that are found to create a nuisance to adjoining landowners or any issues that are found to be in violation of any Mower County Ordinance, and
9. The Owner/ Applicant shall provide adequate area onsite to park, back, turn-around so as to not create a nuisance or hazard to the traveling public. Vehicles used or related to this CUP application cannot be parked or backed onto the premises from the road or its right-of-way; and
10. Waste materials shall not be allowed to accumulate upon this property. Waste material must be properly disposed of according to appropriate or regulated methods. Any waste material that is maintained on the premises for future disposal must be contained indoors or fully screened from the public so not to create a nuisance. Removal of the waste material shall be at least one time per year or more frequently as needed; and
11. Owner/Applicant shall abide by all road and bridge weight restrictions or postings that apply to roads used as an ingress/egress to the property; and
12. Owner/Applicant shall obtain a permit from Mower County Public Works Department (Hwy Department) if widening the driveway located on a County Road; and
13. The Owner/Applicant shall be liable for any road damages as a result of this operation as stated under MN Statute 169.88; and
14. No burying of waste material is allowed and to do so would be in violation of MPCA Regulations and Mower County Solid Waste Ordinance; and
15. A conditional use permit shall become void two (2) years from the date of approval by the County Board if no construction has begun or the use has not been established. For the purposes of this provision, construction shall include the installation of

- footings, slab, foundation, posts, walls or other portions of a building. Site preparation, land clearing or the installation of utilities shall not constitute construction. A conditional use permit shall become void if the use is discontinued for a period of one (1) year. (Refer Section 14-36 Discontinuance); and

Additional revisions to the agreement (designed to protect Mower County and the four townships within the project area) are anticipated before it is ready to be finalized and approved by the Board.

Nancy Schnable, Executive Director of Austin Convention and Visitor's Bureau, provided the Board with the bureau's 2013 Annual Report.
