Commissioner Gabrielson reported that the Personnel Committee had discussed an annual approval of the Staffing Levels for each department. The approved staffing levels are based on the budget approved by the Board for 2019. The outcome would be to permit the Human Resources Director to proceed with filling vacancies as they occur rather than wait on Board approval. Policy B130, Recruitment and Selection, provides for authorization to permit the Human Resources Director to fill vacancies according to union contract and County policies.

Motion made by Commissioner Gabrielson, seconded by Commissioner Bennett, to maintain the use of Policy B130, Recruitment and Selection, and to approve the annual staffing levels for 2019 for all departments as on file in Human Resources. Motion carried.

Commissioner Gabrielson reported on behalf of the Personnel committee that the Sheriff elect, Steve Sandvik, had submitted a written request for a leave of absence, from his current position of Sergeant Investigator, per MN Statute 3.088. This statute permits a leave of absence for up to 10 years when elected to a County Office.

Motion made by Commissioner Gabrielson, seconded by Commissioner Ankeny, to approve Steve Sandvik's request for a leave of absence from the position of Sergeant Investigator under MN Statute 3.088 effective January 7, 2019 and an end date as defined in the aforementioned statute. Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Ankeny, seconded by Commissioner Gabrielson, to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Federally Qualified Health Centers, the Minnesota Department of Health and Mower County Health and Human Services for Deputizing and Oversight of Public Health Departments to Provide Vaccine for Children vaccine to entitled underinsured children. Motion carried.

Lisa Kocer provided the Board Community Health Updates which included information pertaining to increased MnChoice Assessment requests and a summary of the 2018 Health Alerts.

Terese Amazi, County Sheriff, and Steven Reinartz, County Auditor-Treasurer, were unable to be present at the Board to receive recognition for their years of service.

Commissioner Glynn on behalf of the Finance Committee provided additional information pertaining to citizens who had not obtain zoning permits for structures erected based on an analysy of GIS mapping. The Committee is recommending setting a deadline for submitting after-the-fact zoning permits without incurring the penalty fee.

Motion made by Commissioner Glynn, seconded by Commissioner Gabrielson, to set February 28, 2019 as the deadline for properties that constructed structures without proper zoning permits to make proper applications without penalty and to set an additional deadline of June 30, 2019 for said property owners who desire to move structures constructed without a zoning permit out of the floodplain boundaries and/or those within setback regulations. WHEREAS, 2014 Session Law Chapter 308 enacted by the Legislature provides Minnesota counties a County Program Aid grant for Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) prevention. The amount designated for each county is based on the number of watercraft trailer launches as well as the number of watercraft trailer parking spaces within each county; and

WHEREAS, the legislation requires that Mower County must establish, by resolution or through adoption of a plan, guidelines for the use of the proceeds which are to prevent the introduction or limit the spread of aquatic invasive species at all access sites within the county; and

WHEREAS, the County may appropriate the proceeds directly or may use any portion of the proceeds to provide funding for a joint powers board or cooperative agreement with another political subdivision, a soil and water conservation district in the county, a watershed district in

the county, or a lake association located in the county. Any money appropriated by the county to a different entity or political subdivision must be used as required under this section; and

WHEREAS, the County utilizes the 2014 AIS Prevention Aid Funds and sequential years as intended and described by state statute; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners of Mower County adopt the following 2019 Aquatic Invasive Species work plan and budget using 2019 County Program Aid AIS funds and, if necessary, designated AIS reserves from prior year AIS allocations:
